What a great day we had yesterday at the Small Schools Athletics Carnival. We had age champions in Ottilie and Caelan and Jere was a runner up in his age group. Overall, TOWAMBA WON! We use a handicap system at our carnivals and this system ensures that the smaller schools are not at a disadvantage. I will try to find out the last time we won a carnival, but initial thoughts are that it has been a while. Congratulations everyone. Every student that participates in an event earns points for their school and every point helped yesterday. Congratulations Towamba.

It was wonderful to have Towamba, Wyndham, Candelo, Bemboka and Tanja all together. The day takes an enormous level of organisation from the host school and lots of extra time for participating schools in organising practices and trials to determine our field event participants. Thank you very much to Wyndham for a well organised event. It was a beautiful winter day, even though it was a little soggy underfoot. Thank you to everyone for transporting the students to Wyndham and to those who were able to stay for the day and enjoy the carnival. I understand that not all parents/carers are able to stay due to other commitments, but I hope the students were able to come home and share some happy moments.

I thought I would take this opportunity to offer a little more information about how students are selected for the field events and relays. As we have five schools who participate on the day, we are able to put through two students for each field event. With two students from each school, we still struggle to get through the day in time. Generally, the top two performers in the trials are put through. It is not possible to put every student in each event, otherwise it would take days to get through the carnival. There are three age brackets; Junior (8, 9 and 10 years), 11 years and Senior (12 years and above). The junior age bracket is the tough one to get through, as it may have students from Year 2 all the way to Year 5, as it did this year. However students in Year 2 have lots more opportunities to get through in the coming years, so it generally works out in the end with most students having the opportunity to participate. This works the same way in bigger schools who just have their own carnival. Small schools are not at a disadvantage in this arrangement. I hope this helps to clarify the way the system works.

Now that we are through the carnival, the 3-6 class will focus on the upcoming SCLC practice and concert next week (Week 8). Our rehearsals are going well and we hope to be able to put on a great show for the audience.

The following week (Week 9) K-6 are heading off for our excursion to Eden to walk part of the Bundian Way and visit the Eden Whale museum. To round out the term on Tuesday Week 10, we have the end of term assembly. We hope to see you there! Lots on to round our Term 2.

Please remember to have the payment finalised by the end of this term. If you do the payment in two halves and send the receipt for half to the P&C they can reimburse you directly. What wonderful support.


End of Term Assembly




